EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Blood pressure measurement and assessment

- Demonstrate appropriate technique in measuring a blood pressure.
- Explain common mistakes resulting in potentially inaccurate blood pressure readings.
- Appropriately interpret blood pressure readings.
- Identify patients requiring referral to their primary health care provider for follow-up or intervention.

Asthma – peak flow meter measurement and assessment

- Illustrate effective use of home peak flow monitors utilized in self-monitoring for patients with asthma.
- Educate patients on how to carry out an asthma action plan in response to peak flow readings.

Asthma – proper use of inhalation devices

- Demonstrate proper inhaler technique for both pressurized metered-dose and dry-powder inhalers.
- Describe common mistakes made by individuals utilizing both pressurized metered-dose and dry-powder inhalers.
- Explain the advantages of spacers and valved-holding chambers.
- Demonstrate the proper use of spacers and valved-holding chambers.

Glucometer teaching

- Demonstrate proper home blood glucose testing.
- Discuss goals for blood glucose readings in individuals with diabetes.
- Describe the recommendations and rationale for frequency of monitoring for patients with type 1 and type 2 diabetes.

Insulin and injection techniques

- Compare and contrast the distinguishing properties of available insulins.
- Demonstrate effective counseling to patients initiating insulin therapy.
- Illustrate proper administration of insulin using vial/syringe and insulin pens.
- Explain how to detect and treat hypoglycemia.

Please Note Important Changes

The reporting and tracking of your CE credits has changed. A new (national) mandatory reporting system will begin with our Summer 2012 Program. The National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) and the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) will require each pharmacist to obtain an NABP e-Profile identification number. To obtain your e-Profile ID, you must log into the portal in the Pharmacists section of the NABP Web site at www.nabp.net/pharmacists. Technicians can obtain their ID by creating an NABP e-Profile using the portal in the Technicians section of the NABP Web site at www.nabp.net/technicians.

Our office has begun this nationally mandated transition. We cannot process any future registrations without your NABP e-profile ID number and your date of birth in the mm/dd format. We don't need the year you were born. This NABP number is now required to register for all seminars.
