EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Explain how self-induced conditions determine the fate of therapy for many chronic diseases.
- List eligibility criteria for various medication-assistance options.
- Discuss how to adjust warfarin doses and review management of elevated INRs.
- Recognize successful strategies for negotiating and overcoming resistance.
- Describe common adverse reactions, drug interactions, contraindications, precautions, and monitoring parameters.
- Develop strategies for specific groups of patients to minimize risk of NSAID toxicities, including those patients receiving chronic low-dose aspirin therapy.
- Outline the frequencies and time frames for attempting gradual dose reductions of the various psychotropic medication classes.
- Evaluate ethical obligations for practitioners related to side effects of opiates.
- Evaluate alternative methods for treating patients' pain in the acute-care setting.
- Describe patients who are more susceptible to myotoxicity and AST/ALT elevations.
- Determine whether new “me-too” drugs are more efficacious or safer than their older counterparts.
- Describe novel therapies and drugs in the pipeline for the treatment of Parkinson's disease.
- Formulate a plan for treating commonly encountered infectious diseases.
- Describe the steps pharmacists should take if they are considering starting an innovative pharmacy practice.

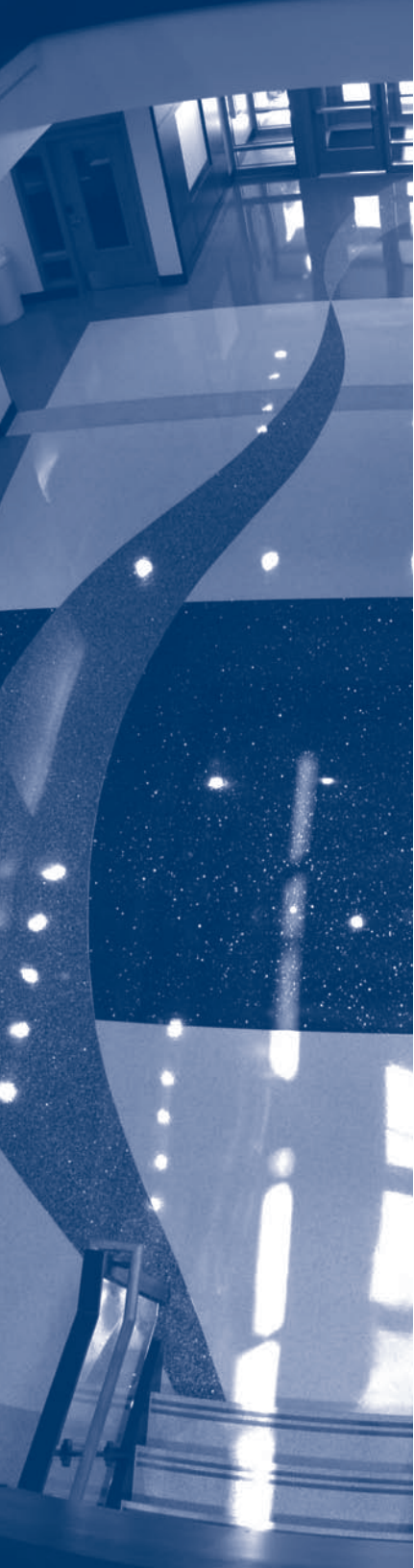
