Program Goals & Objectives

- Discuss and apply changes in legal regulations pertaining to pharmacy practice in long-term care settings.
- Discuss the therapeutic efficacy of new drugs and their approved indications.
- Describe common adverse reactions, contraindications, and precautions associated with routine use.
- Provide information on the administration, adverse effects, and efficacy of the new antiretroviral medications: raltegravir, **etravirine**, and maraviroc.
- Discuss the pharmacologic management of atrial fibrillation.
- Explain the disease link between diabetes and peripheral neuropathy, including the natural progression.
- Discuss pain management for patients with substance use disorders.
- Discuss current recommendations in the treatment of agitation and aggression in the patient with dementia.
- Describe the common causes of drug related problems (DRPs) in elderly patients.
- Identify key medications and medication classes that are commonly involved in drug interactions in elderly patients.
- Discuss and evaluate common drug interactions between psychiatric medications and medications for treatment of other conditions.
- Outline the therapeutic approach for treating Alzheimer's disease.
- Provide management recommendations for the treatment of Autism spectrum disorders.
- Provide management recommendations for patients diagnosed with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder.
- Critically evaluate appropriate treatment options based on clinical presentation of MRSA.
