Tenure or Clinical Track Assistant/Associate/Full Professor

The Department of Pharmacy Practice of the Auburn University Harrison School of Pharmacy (AUHSOP) is seeking a full-time Assistant/Associate/Full Professor or an Assistant/Associate/Full Clinical Professor to serve as clinical coordinator for Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experiences (IPPE). This individual's primary responsibility will be the overall operation of the IPPE program and the supervision of care provided to patients enrolled in the program and in the Auburn University Pharmaceutical Care Clinic.

Job responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Coordinate and provide overall operation of the Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experiences (IPPE) program; coordinate and supervise pharmacy care provided to patients enrolled in the program;
- Conduct a scholarship program consistent with the needs of the IPPE program as well as the faculty member's professional goals and interests;
- Provide pharmaceutical care services to patients in a primary care practice within the Auburn University Pharmaceutical Care Center (AUPCC);
- Precept student pharmacists in Primary Care in the Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPE)
- Participate in student-centered pharmacotherapeutics instruction to third year PharmD students at Auburn University Harrison School of Pharmacy and;
- Participate in University and School governance through committee service.

Depending upon experience, qualifications, and interest, successful candidates may be appointed to either a tenure-track (Assistant/Associate/Full Professor) or a non-tenure track (Assistant/Associate/Full Clinical Professor) position. Applicants must possess a Pharm.D. degree with a postgraduate residency and be eligible for pharmacy licensure in the state in which they practice. Additional consideration will be given to candidates who have completed a fellowship or specialty residency and board certification. Salary will be competitive and commensurate with education and experience. The candidate selected for this position must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the United States at the time the appointment is scheduled to begin and continue working legally for the proposed term of employment.

The successful candidate must have excellent interpersonal and practice management skills; be able to facilitate, motivate, and influence others; and demonstrate exceptional teamwork skills. Candidates must be interested in, and have experience with, pharmacy education reform and be committed to diversity.

Review of applications will begin January 3, 2012 and will continue until the position is filled.
